


SupportEd English Learner (EL) Master Plan Development Process

Development Process Steps	Timeline
Conduct on-site meetings and classroom observations with district administrators to begin needs assessment process.	Early Fall
Conduct on-site or virtual interviews with district key stakeholders, review student data, and conduct online teacher surveys.	Early Fall
3. Prepare summary of district needs based on results of meetings, classroom visits, interviews, student data review, and surveys to identify initial key themes for EL Action Plan outline.	Mid-Fall
 Conduct ongoing weekly or bi-weekly virtual meetings with district administrators for EL Master Plan development (SupportEd and District Project Management Team). 	Throughout academic year
Identify and select stakeholders for district Internal and Community Working Groups to provide input and feedback for plan development.	Late Fall
6. Meet onsite with Internal and Community Working Groups to obtain feedback and input on initial key themes identified in needs summary and solicit additional themes from groups.	Late Fall
7. Develop EL Master Plan Outline and meet with Internal and Community Working groups to solicit feedback and input for next phase of plan development.	Early Winter
8. Continue developing EL Master Plan in an iterative cycle, incorporating stakeholder feedback and input in each subsequent iteration of the plan.	Late Winter
 Finalize and produce EL Master Plan (with final graphics) after iterative process has concluded when district administrators and stakeholders are satisfied with final draft of plan. 	Early Spring
10. Distribute final plan to district, implement, and evaluate results.	After final plan is approved within district
